Notes:

- Former producers Argentina, Belgium, and Chile have renounced future production either as a matter of declaratory policy or national legislation.
- The production capacity for cluster munitions no longer exists in the Netherlands. Switzerland states it no longer produces. Neither country has formally renounced future production.
- The state pension funds in Ireland and New Zealand have chosen to disinvest from companies that produce cluster munitions. National legislation in Belgium prohibits direct or indirect investment in companies that produce cluster munitions.
- In Norway, the Government Pension Fund - Global (*Statens pensjonsfond – Utland*; known prior to January 2006 as the Petroleum Fund of Norway) has divested from the following companies that produce cluster munitions: Alliant Techsystems, European Aeronautic Defence and Space Company EADS N.V., Hanwha Corporation, General Dynamics, L3 Communications Holdings Inc, Lockheed Martin, Poongsan Corporation, Raytheon, and Thales SA.
- KBC Bank in Belgium has disinvested in the following publicly-traded companies because of their involvement in the production of cluster munitions: Aerostar, Alliant Techsystems, Aselsan, BAE Systems, EADS, Finmeccanica, GenCorp, General Dynamics, Honeywell International, L-3 Communications, Lockheed Martin, Magellan Aerospace, Northrop Grumman, Poongsan, Raytheon, Rheinmetall, and Thales.
